Introduction

Key Spaces: The Print Shop and The ARTery

Holyoke Art operates two main spaces in downtown Holyoke, both of which serve as engines of economic activity and tourism.

- 1. **The Print Shop** at 62 Main Street is a DIY makerspace equipped with commercial printing tools and production equipment, including wide-format, 3D, and vinyl cutting machines. It serves as a hub for job training in graphic design, print production, and entrepreneurship, particularly for local youth. Through partnerships with organizations such as Holyoke Public Schools and MassHire, The Print Shop provides valuable job skills, helping young people enter the workforce with practical experience. It also offers services to local businesses, contributing to the economic vitality of downtown Holyoke by helping to brand and promote their services with professional signage, decals, and promotional materials. - 2. The ARTery at 289 High Street functions as both a retail marketplace and an economic platform for over 100 local artists and artisans. This space allows creators to sell handmade goods, generating income for both the artists and Holyoke Art. The ARTery attracts visitors from across the region, becoming a tourism destination for those looking for unique, locally crafted items. By supporting local creatives, The ARTery helps build a strong, culturally rich downtown that draws foot traffic and boosts surrounding businesses. Additionally, The SPLATery, a paint room located in The ARTery, serves as a regional draw and major fundraiser, bringing visitors from outside the city and adding to the vibrancy of downtown Holyoke. Transforming Vacant Buildings and Spaces

Holyoke Art is actively working to repurpose vacant and underutilized buildings, transforming them into thriving cultural spaces that support economic growth and attract tourism.

- **52 Main Street:** We are rehabilitating this vacant four-story building to serve as our future home, complete with ADA-accessible classrooms, office space, and potentially live/work spaces for artists. By transforming this structure, we are not only preserving a historic building but also creating a new destination for artists, educators, and visitors, further increasing foot traffic and economic activity in the area.
- **400 High Street Lot Activation:** Working with partners like the TDI District, the City, and local property owners, we are activating this vacant lot with community programming,

outdoor dining, art classes, and events such as movie nights. This project will transform an empty space into a bustling community hub, driving foot traffic, supporting local businesses, and attracting visitors to downtown Holyoke. - Revenue-Generating Initiatives: Holyoke Art's business model emphasizes sustainability through revenue-generating programs. The Print Shop offers membership fees, material fees, and contract services, while The ARTery generates income through art sales. These initiatives reduce reliance on grants, helping Holyoke Art become a self-sustaining institution that contributes to the local economy year-round.

Tourism and Economic Impact

 events enhance Holyoke's reputation as a vibrant cultural destination and demonstrate
